George Washington was the only president to be unanimously elected. He laid down the cornerstone of the Capitol building in the District of Columbia. Washington was also the first president to invoke the presidential veto. He also rejected the movement among army officers to make him King of America.

Attaining the military rank of a four-star General, George Washington never attended college. President Washington was born on February 22nd, 1732, though his birthday is celebrated on the third Monday of February.

When Washington died, his friend, Dr. Thorton, tried to bring him back to life, by freezing, thawing and performing a blood transfusion with a lamb.

As a farmer, Washington grew and promoted the use of marijuana, though marijuana was mostly har-



vested for its use as hemp; he was also credited to introducing the mule to America. Washington was the only Founding Father to free his slaves.

The story of Washington chopping down a cherry tree was a myth created by his biographer after his death, to emphasize Washington's honesty.

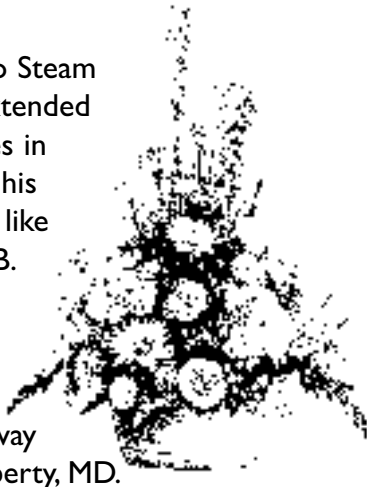

Get Well Wishes

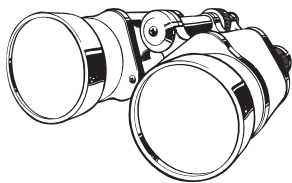

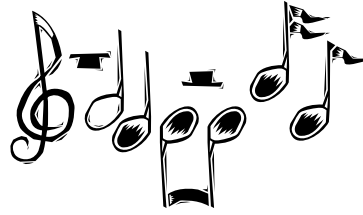

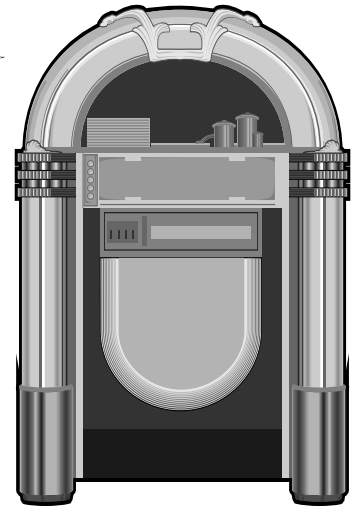
